BECOMING A BLESSED CHURCH STUDY

This is a synopsis of the introduction to Graham Standish's book on "Becoming a Blessed Church."

He states that the reason so many churches are failing and fading is because they have not truly allowed themselves. . . the members. . . to FEEL and UNDERSTAND THE PURPOSE, PRESENCE AND POWER OF GOD! Until they do, they are simply marking time with programs and being busy failing their members and Christ since they are not experiencing the reality of God in their personal and corporate lives. You can have all the programs, parties, suppers, Bible studies, prayer groups, worship services, contemporary bands and social activities you want and still fail to become more transformed and "blessed" by the life of the Holy Spirit working within the members and the congregation. To Standish, "blessed" means to "be raised to". It is only when we have been "raised to" "KNOWING GOD.. .EXPERIENCING HIS PURPOSE, PRESENCE AND POWER. . ." that there is any real hope for LIFE. It is only by having this opportunity can we ever hope to enjoy the "rising up" God wants for each of us. So, his book is to give you and me the opportunity to discover exactly what God's PURPOSE is both for us and through us as a congregation. He also plans to help us know how better to EXPERIENCE God's PRESENCE. From this, we can grow and glow in the wonderful feeling of our own spiritual needs.

You see, to Graham, the goal is not to be successful or get numbers or be more involved or busy or anything else. Some of these. . .MAY. ..happen but these will only be the by-products. . .outcomes.. . of the more important spiritual insight and growth we can be blessed to have as a result of this study.

There were other parts of his introduction as to his own life and travels and sense of emptiness and how he came to where he is today. It seems he tried just about anything else out there in this world to find a sense of satisfaction but nothing worked. He planned to be a counselor and he worked in the mental health field but, finally, his living experiences and studies brought him to where he is today. He also got his doctorate in the study of Spirituality and used some of this in the writing of this important book.

I will send more synopses of each chapter each month to you. In this way, you can be prepared both to save time and get more out of the time we do spend on this when the Session does meet together.

Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrews,

A wealthy man decided to go on a safari in Africa. He took his faithful pet dachshund along for company. One day the dachshund started chasing butterflies and before long the dachshund discovered that he was lost. While wandering about, he notices a leopard heading rapidly in his direction with the obvious intention of having him for lunch. The dachshund thinks, "Okay, I'm in deep trouble now!" Then he noticed some bones on the ground close by and immediately settles down to chew on the bones with his back to the approaching cat.

Just as the leopard is about to leap, the dachshund exclaims loudly, "Boy, that was one delicious leopard. I wonder if there are any more around here." Hearing this, the leopard halts his attack in mid-stride, as a look of terror comes over him, and slinks away into the trees. "Whew," says the leopard. "That was close. That dachshund nearly had me."

Meanwhile, a monkey who had been watching the whole scene from a nearby tree figures he can put this knowledge to good use and trade it for protection from the leopard. So, off he goes, but the dachshund saw him heading after the leopard with great speed and figured that something must be up. The monkey soon catches up with the leopard, spills the beans and strikes a deal for himself with the leopard. The leopard is furious at being made a fool of and says, "Here, monkey, hop on my back and just see what's going to happen to that conniving canine."

Now the dachshund sees the leopard coming with the monkey on his back and thinks, "What am I going to do now?" But instead of running, the dog sits down with his back to his attackers, pretending he hasn't seen them and just when they get close enough to hear, the dachshund says, "Where is that monkey? I sent him off an hour ago to bring me another leopard."

If you can't outrun them, outwit them.

I have been pondering the difference between wisdom and knowledge. Some of the lectionary passages I have been studying address this issue. In scripture, wisdom is the opposite of folly. Knowledge is something that we gain from school and books. Wisdom is something we gain from life experiences, making mistakes and gleaning from our elders. Someone can be wise without a diploma or degree. Wisdom is also something we gain learning, growing and studying with others.

Christian Education and nurture helps us grow not only in knowledge but also in wisdom. One of the responsibilities of all Christians is to grow spiritually and deepen their faith life. We are never too old or young to learn and grow in our faith. One way to grow spiritually and gain wisdom is to attend Bible Study on Thursday mornings. You will learn, grow in your faith and have fun all at the same time.






SALVATION ARMY
