The Care and Feeding of A New Pastor

- 1. Please watch having our expectations set too high about any pastor. They are only human and can know and do only so much. One of the biggest problems any pastor and congregation has is when either or both expect too much of one another. It is a set-up for growing disappointment. I am not trying to rain on anyone's parade, but studies have shown that this is a large cause of later issues. Mutual grace must bind on the part of both. God pastors imperfect on purpose! To remind us that all of us are needed!
- 2. Give the pastor time to work his/her way into your culture and hearts 10 or so months, at least. If you may be a bit slow in accepting him/her, it may be because you want to avoid getting too close too soon to void feeling past pains again. He/she will want to hear what you have to suggest for your lives here, but he/she will need time to get a real emotional "feel" for himself or herself, in order that his/her suggestions may be more "on target" for you to consider and ACT upon together. Sometimes what we say we want for our church means we may have to . . . get this . . . CHANGE! Are you sure you REALLY want new members and better programming? If you really do want change, go beyond talking and planning to actually helping bring about the very changes you say you so badly hope for.
- 3. Some churches support the pastor when its Search Committee serves as a kind of on-going, on-call advisory group for the pastor for the first year. This prevents early troubles setting in, in case he or she has some good ideas that could accidentally step on some "sacred cows" the pastor did not even know were there!
- 4. Charlie Shedd, pastor/writer, used to say, "If you want to keep and get the most out of your pastor talk him (her) up, pray him (her) up and talk him (her) up in your community."
- 5. If this person has a spouse, let him/her become a part of you life as he/she feels to be best and true to himself/herself and his/her own talents and interests. This person is not to be an unpaid "assistant pastor." He/she will enter areas of your life as he/she wishes.
- 6. If there are children involved, make them feel as welcomed as the new pastor and his/her partner. Recognize them at the welcoming events, etc. The children and partner need to feel that they are really appreciated and want to feel that his is their home and community, too. It helps the pastor when he/she feels their partner and children are happy to be here with you.
- 7. Support their home life. Encourage them to take time off . . . together, for obvious reasons.
- 8. Pastors do not have real close friends in a congregation. Oh, like all of us, some are easier to be with and know better than others. Still, he/she cannot have "favorites," but are here to be equally warm and available to all. They are to be professionals more than just being buddies or pals.
- 9. Make him/her take their vacations and study leaves . . . to STUDY for your good.

- 10. He/she is not a "hired hand," but a part of a dynamic system that works together, with Pastoral/Sessional leadership to assist you in moving even more into fulfilling the goals and missions you set for yourselves before ;you selected him or her.
- 11. Any pastor will need a few very trusted confidants . . . allies . . . to run things by or unload and clear things up with. If you are the one, feel honored and respect his/her confidentiality. Some members entertain themselves by finding little faults and picking on pastors. They feel called to be the "pastor police". Get the facts before you judge.
- 12. Respect his/her time for office study and prayer and his/her need for recreation!
- 13. Focus on what is important. Don't let yourselves get hung up on "the small stuff," if differences come up, as they will. Keep personality (ego) out of things, as you can. If some misunderstanding arises, as it will from time to time, keep open and speak TO and not ABOUT one another.
- 14. While you expect your pastor to "lead you" (which assumes you think he/she will always "know" what is best for you), you will not always comply, in spite of what you say you plan to do, by giving in to his/hr suggestions! It may seem contradictory to him/her at times, especially in terms of what you want in worship services. Plan to be flexible and remember to use grace and humor quite a bit at such times. He/she does have the right to set the service and the messages in our denomination.

Finally, focus on what Paul recommended: "Whatsoever things are true, pure, right, holy, friendly, proper and worthy of praise, think on these things." Then the God of Peace will be with each and all of you.

Did you notice our positive cash flow for 2017 at our Congregation meeting, January 28, 2018?

The Annual Report showed our net worth increased due to Condo being sold and a positive budget year! Our income/expenses for 2017 was *a positive of \$1,563.66*. Our *first* positive since 2003!!

Thrift Store yearly contribution made the difference. A <u>BIG</u> thank you for all who give and work with the Thrift Store. There were no salary changes. The Operating Expenses increased 10%. Only committee to get an increase is M/E. Increased \$1,200 to give Gleaners \$100 a month. Designated Offerings - down 13% from 2016.

Major expenses, not part of the 2017 budget, were Refrigerator for Fellowship Hall, Media Room Update and Sanctuary Painted.

If you see any problems at Church, please let myself or any B&G member know.


