BECOMING A BLESSED CHURCH (PART 3)

The Church started with Abraham. The Christian Church started at Pentecost...when the Holy Spirit entered into the disciples and it was an AH-HAH moment! The point is, until each of us ASPIRES TO BE INSPIRED, our local church will EXPIRE! Read that again. If we are disciples and really want to try and be followers by word and deed, we must know in a deep, personal way, the place and practical importance of Jesus Christ in our own personal life. We simply cannot give away or share what we do not have. We can only know, in a personal/practical way, who Jesus is and the absolute awesomeness of Him by being people of the BOOK, people of PRAYER and with OTHERS who know Him. We call these (and the Sacraments) "the Means of Grace". There is no shortcut to be able to know him emotionally and be strengthened to be able to make him known to others....period! If you ever hope to know anyone, it is best to spend time talking with them and watching how they come across to make some impression on you.

The trouble with most churches is that they have lost VIBRANCY and have fallen into the trap of FUNCTIONALISM....playing at being church with heady stuff (Robert's Rules of Order, Books of Order, the usual way of going about church "business" TOO much. Today, it is easier to organize a thousand people than it is to redeem one of them! We have lost our understanding of our PURPOSE...to know Him and to make Him known; to know inwardly that we have been blessed with the Christ story so as to become a blessing to others. The healthy church cares for the whole person and works to allow each member to become "integrated" and "balanced" spiritually, mentally, physically and relationally, so that each may get their own life together and then be in a healthy relationship with God, first and foremost, and then be in relationships with all others. This is a major Gift of God for God's entire world.for the world to get its head screwed on right and to get its "act together". Surely, by now, you know what the world is like without God at the helm.

These areas are also important: a Session that earnestly prays, trying always to think and act as to what the leaders really feel would make God smile....place God's agenda for God's people over egos or anything else. The worship experience should be one that helps others feel the Truth of God, helps them know how to live, how to remain in touch with God and find ways to live into the future. Good leadership, being truly "God-centered", is an absolute must. Even the Session's docket should reflect a worship experience...candles, hymns, prayers, a sense of seriousness about their high calling.

Again, it is so important that we earnestly "aspire" to be "inspired", so that the Holy Spirit will bless us and that this church will not expire. As the Psalmist reminds us, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it" (Psalm 127:1).

WHERE TO FROM HERE FOR ST. ANDREWS?

Remember the three-legged stool? Which leg is more important when you suspect that each leg has its place? The three "legs" include the following (in order of importance): (A) A church who really knows Jesus Christ and feels the place and importance of Him in their personal lives. They make it their aim to please Him because they realize that only in Him can we truly live and move and find our true being. (B) Now, feeling the truth of this, they constantly try as hard as they can to make Him known to others. He is too good not to both spread and share this tremendously, wonderful, lifegiving news! Now, having known Him and feeling compelled to make Him known we can expect the next step automatically to take place....grow in membership as the result of A and B. Membership growth is the natural outcome... the "C" leg... of this stool. Now you have the formula for a bright future.

Sounds good on paper and not all members will share in this venture because it takes faithful planning and faithful follow through. "A" requires a lot of things taking place such as faithful Bible study, honest prayer and sharing together. It takes listening to people outside our congregation as to what would make worship a more meaningful part of their lives....good Biblical preaching, uplifting music, a warm fellowship of believers whose lives are caringly intertwined and very welcoming of others with their ideas and suggestions taken seriously. This may foster a few changes and adjustments. As I said, planning and acting on our plans are absolute musts. This is the most important part for St. Andrews having a future here.

The "B" part also takes consistent planning and action. Here are a few ways to approach making Christ known: 1. Where is the "market" we hope to target...older, middle aged or younger people? I suspect it will be the first two in light of the community around us. Will you include them in your discussions and decisions? This will require member education and some training to do it well. 2. It may involve many ways to use different types of media to let others around us know that we know their needs and have ways to address them. 3. It may involve taking on things like having Social Services and leadership from area Presbyterian Churches using our rooms for parent training classes, money management classes, etc. 4. It would mean faithfully following up on any and all who use our property for any reason...once we obtain their names and addresses or phone numbers. 5. It may involve writing very tailor-made types of notes to new residents in our area codes that we find in each Friday's paper. 6. It may involve finding the names of those on the church roll of Faith Lutheran Church and making contact with them....and other churches that have closed around us. 7. It may mean offering space for business persons to come and offer ways people can be trained for job interviews and how to find employment. It may mean finding persons needing help on how to shop and make use of their limited finances or how to sew and become independently employed by use of skills they have learned. Well, you get the point. Visibility, visibility, visibility! Folks would really miss us if St. Andrews were not here. They need to recognize this and step up and be involved with us for their own sakes and share and care for the community we live in.

Any pastor you get will know much of this and would expect you to be serious about growth with him or her. May the Holy Spirit drive us to commit to "grow forward into Christ together"!
