COME HOME TO THE "REAL" CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY

What do I mean by THAT...the REAL community? Well, too many members these days seem to want to be in the IDEAL Christian community. The fact is, there isn't one! Even if I were to find it, I would not join! Why?" Because it would have me as a member then it would no longer be ideal!

No one congregation has members who have it "all together". If they appear to have it "all together" they would be judgmental and spiritually be so arrogant that they would soon be intolerable to other mere mortals around them. Dietrich Bonhoeffer (a martyred German pastor during WWII) once wrote in his Life Together book....pages 35-36 "....Those who love their dream of Christian Community more than the Christian community, itself become destroyers of that Christian community even through their personal intentions may be ever so honest, earnest, and sacrificial....Those who dream of this idealized community demand that it be fulfilled by God, by other and by themselves. They enter the community of Christians with their demands, set up their own law, and judge one another and even God accordingly. They stand adamant, a living reproach to all others in the Christian community, as if their visionary ideal binds the people together. Whatever does not go their way, they call a failure. When their idealized image is shattered, they see the community breaking to pieces. So they first become accusers of other Christians in the community then accusers of God, and finally the desperate accusers of themselves."

Most, however, are not that idealistic at all. They have lived so long that they know what the world and people are like. On the whole, we....few of us....are all THAT good in the first place. Most of us would feel more at home in a community of people who are like ourselves....frail, even less than human at times and needing Grace, Mercy and gentle understanding.

How blessed you are! This is exactly what St. Andrews is like! We are not a "weekly meeting of Saints trying to keep in touch with antiquity". We are a hospital for sinners. Each of us has some, dare I say it, pooh-pooh in our lives in one way or to some degree or another. It stinks. But, with God here at St. Andrews in and through us, He can spread it out and let it dry. Then, with His Love and Grace, He can and does grow "flowers" out of it! And, are we ever glad and grateful!

The point of this is that, to any of you who have not been attending for either of the above two reasons: that the members here are not "good enough" to deserve you joining with us or feel you will be judged in some way by us if you do come back, forget it. We love you and have missed you. If you need us to stand with you or by you in times of stress, we are still here for you.



WHY DON'T FOLKS LIKE THE CHURCH ANYMORE?

These are some of the comments I hear: "Folks there are too quick to judge" or "I don't understand the service and the hymns can be boring" or "Who believes stories like that anymore? This is an age of science and I would feel bad if some of my college friends would see me come out of some churches."

Others say people there are too opinionated, too stuck on themselves, hypocritical, too prejudices, etc.

Frankly, it is a hard world now. Ours is a "post modern age". People used to look to science for the answer to almost all of the world's problems. Not anymore....since the nuclear age. Most folks realize that life can be scary! This is because we may have nuclear bombs but the same old kind of people are still running politics and have other values than the ones the Christian Church holds. Mix in materialism, sexism, ageism, militarism, secularism and even individualism (where I know what is best for me and I know more than others do and I am "free" and can pretty much say and do as I wish in America). We don't compete just with other churches. We compete with all this other "isms" and "gods" I just mentioned. In fact, churches need to start making better testimonies in better unison ways if they hope to offer this Gospel "Treasure" we have in this clay pot religion of ours.

What has the Church got to offer to all of this and how can it offer it?

- We can offer challenges. For example, we are asked by Christ not just to offer membership to people but discipleship! Do they know enough personally to be able to do it?
- We still have an almost unbelievable message: that a man has come back from the dead and dares to call Himself the Way, The Truth and The Life. This challenges some to have to wonder if they really do understand what the "Truth" is. What is meant by the "Way"? What does a better "Life" look and be like? We had better know what these terms mean, personally.
- What are the meaning and purpose and direction of life that the Church has to offer others who may or may not be open even to raise such questions until age or tragedy strikes? We had better be equipped to offer something!
- Where is the remnant of what is "human" in a world fast growing into technology, genetic manipulation and robotic mechanics where people are becoming obsolete or no longer needed in the labor force....except to get training to fix robots? It's a big, demanding world out there.
- Do we have anything to offer what is Triumphant to a world full of the tracic?
- Can we help balance the temptations to retreat to what is "local" for safety vs. the demand on all of us as to what has to be global with the challenges and threats to these?
- How can we offer the comfort and courage of God to a world that needs an "Alpha and an Omega" when it hardly recognizes that it is in need of one?
- We say we know our future and our identity and our calling because have been invited into Life. Are we willing to share our understanding? How? Where? And When?

Here the Church sits, a Bridge between the world as it is and the Hope we claim we have to offer. How will we live out our FAITH in our day and time so that when our life ends we will abide with and in "God's Ages to come"?

<u>Have You Named St. Andrews Presbyterian Church in Your Will?</u>

A properly executed will permits you to accomplish goals even after your passing. One of those goals may be to create a legacy for St. Andrews Presbyterian Church. A bequest in your will might be a specified amount, a percentage of your estate, or a residual amount (after expenses and other bequests have been deducted).

Speak with your attorney about how best to include St. Andrews Presbyterian Church in your will given your special circumstances. Although your attorney can assist you with specific language here is some typical language that might help you get the conversation started with your attorney.

General Bequest:

A general bequest is among the most popular ways to make a planned gift. In a general bequest, you leave a specified dollar amount: "I give ______(insert dollar amount) to St. Andrews Presbyterian Church, 6317 103rd Street, Jacksonville, FL 32210 as an unrestricted gift."

Percentage of Estate:

You can also designate some portion of percentage of your estate: "I give _______% (insert specific percentage) of my estate to St. Andrews Presbyterian Church, 6317 103rd Street, Jacksonville, FL 32210, after all debts, taxes, expenses, and all other requests have been paid as an unrestricted gift."

Residuary Request:

You can also designate what some describe as a residuary bequest: "I give the remainder of the property I own at death to the St. Andrews Presbyterian Church, 6317 103rd Street, Jacksonville, FL 32210, after all debts, taxes, expenses and all other bequests have been paid as an unrestricted gift.

St. Andrews Presbyterian Church has a proud heritage, and your gifts and bequests can assure its continuance into the future. The Session would determine if St. Andrews can accept any bequest. Thank you for keeping the promise of that future in your prayers.
