April came in like a lion and appeared that it was going to go out like a wheeze. Things have changed in ways none of us could have imagined since the last newsletter. I had been ahead of the curve and had sent Terry an article for the newsletter but as I thought about it, I realized that whatever I'd said it was no longer relevant considering our current reality.

Reality. It is what it is, although just what it is, is hard to say. We're still trying to figure out what we're dealing with. We're all getting to be familiar with the challenges of social distancing, shortages of toilet paper and antiseptics, gloves and masks.

I am not a medical professional or even a medical amateur, my area of expertise—if I have one—is the supernatural, or in more church jargon, theology. Theology is derived from two Greek words: "Theos" which is Greek for God and "ology" from the Greek word "logos", which when translated to the English, is simply "word". Thus, "theology" translated literally to English is "God word" or "God speak."

I mentioned recently a quote from CS Lewis: "God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks to us in our conscience, but shouts in our pains."

God is shouting at us. We are doubtless wondering what exactly God is saying right now. He has our attention to be sure. I am grateful that most of us are doing pretty well by God's grace. We are all tired of being locked up in our homes, but no one that I know of personally has the Corona virus. Some of us know people who have died or are ill with this stuff and that causes us pain as we grieve their passing, but even then, we grieve mindful of the promise of the resurrection. We are blessed too that none of the members of our congregation have contracted covid-19.

From what we have seen in scripture and experienced in our own lives we can be encouraged that God is still in charge, and that God will bring good out of this mess. During this time of isolation, we would do well to use some of our spare time to enter a time of introspection. God is shouting at America and the world. The message in theological terms is the same as it has always been: Return to me!

King David, on realizing his sin prayed to God to restore his relationship:

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit." (Ps 51:10–12)

Finance & Personnel

Month ending March, 2020 is as follows: Income = \$7,746.11, Expenses = \$7,418.31 equaling a positive balance of \$327.80. March 2020 Year To Date: Income = \$20,901.79, Expenses = \$26,451.24 resulting in a negative balance of \$5,549.45.

The April numbers will result in a larger negative balance since April has 3 payroll periods and our Property Insurance bill of around \$3,000 is due.

At our next Session conference call meeting we will begin the job of evaluating our personnel. Worship will evaluate our Director of Music, Building & Grounds will evaluate Julia and possibly Ken (our grounds keeper) and Session will evaluate the Pastor.

One bright spot – we were granted a waiver from the Presbytery and not required to pay \$295.00 per month to the Board of Pensions for 3 months – March, April and May.

Also, F & P Committee recommended and Session approved the Church applying for a forgivable loan through the CARES Act to cover our staff salaries for 90 days - part of March, April, May and part of June. We encourage you all to keep up your pledges which helps our church pay its bills and commitments.

Our next conference call meeting is June 10th at 10:00am unless we are able to meet in person.


