"I was sick and you took care of me!" Matthew 25:36b

We don't always consider being in a hospital or rehabilitation center as a place of loneliness. There are people all around, coming and going at all hours of the day and night, how could one be lonely under these conditions? The truth is that these along with nursing homes can be places where one can feel totally lost and alone. We all have experienced loneliness and stress at one time or another, but often this is magnified, for folks in the hospital or a nursing home.

These situations can create feelings of loneliness, being away from family and friends, and dealing with sickness, injury, and the many medical conditions that have put you in this strange place, with strange smells, strange sounds, and routines.

I have heard patients question whether anyone remembers them since they are not regular church attenders. Do people know they are in the hospital? What's going to happen to me? Who will take care of me when I leave this place?

Often those having major surgery, such as cardiac surgery, surgery of the back or spine, can experience depression, sometimes severe. It is important to notify the doctors and nurses so this can be treated.

Overall, this loneliness, feeling of isolation, a complete change of environment, can be helped by family and friends. Often, it's not what we say, but our love and concern can remind them of God's love and concern. Phone calls, visits (when possible), cards and notes can help the patient to remain connected. Scripture passages, hymns, and prayers all help to maintain the connection to those parts of a person's life from which they have been temporarily separated.

This church has an amazing ability to reach out in words and actions to those who are sick. If you are not connected to the Prayer Chain Sue Ramsey maintains, speak to Sue and stay up to date with those who need your prayers, your presence, and your loving care.



Game Day continues to meet on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is welcome. We have two types of prayer chains that are active. The first is a Telephone Prayer Chain. If you are on one of those, you would receive one personal telephone call about someone, in particular, who needs prayers, and you would then pass that information along to the next person in your chain. Some people choose to be on that kind of chain because they do not check their computer daily and they prefer the personal touch. I feel that this chain is more for urgent requests also. There is one limitation with that one though, and that is that if I receive a prayer request after 8 p.m. in the evening, I do not activate that one and only rely on the computer prayer chain. If anyone has suggestions about how to improve either of these prayer chains, or would like to be added or deleted, please let us know.

September was a 3 payroll month and October will be negative as well since there is a \$3,000 property insurance bill due.

A consolidated list of Sound Booth needs for the balance of 2022 and 2023 was prepared and a grant request for funding submitted to Presbytery. Dollars are needed to purchase an upgraded receiver and speaker to facilitate more than 3 microphones. Our current 3 microphones are used 1) at the lectern and 2) & 3) with one each Pastor. A 4th microphone is needed to serve as roving during events such as Advent Candle Lightings and Readings or when someone in the pews is speaking. Additionally, the current receiver cannot accommodate a 4th microphone. Also, another \$2,500 is needed to increase the number of inputs connected to the sound board.

The theme of our current Stewardship is "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow" focusing on deepening our relationship with God through both giving money and of our talents – "Today". "Empowering our generosity not just as financial giving but understanding the importance of seeing our giving as a lifelong spiritual discipline" – "Tomorrow". St. Andrews has also been very fortunate with the bequests from deceased members and their families – "Yesterday".
