Greetings from the Buildings and Grounds Committee.

Since the last newsletter, we have had another large limb fall from one of our aged oak trees. Except this time, it fell on the roof over the youth room on the west end of the church. Damage included punching a hole in the roof in two places as well as damaging the air conditioner located on the roof top. Water accumulated on the floor but did not appear to damage the flooring. A field inspector from GuideOne Insurance came out last week and the cost of replacing the air conditioner, repairing the roof, and replacing ceiling tiles will be an eligible expense subject to the policy deductible. We hope to have the new air conditioner installed soon.

Our committee always has a lot of miscellaneous work to do on the grounds. Trash continually is blown on St. Andrew's property from the road. If you could spare a few minutes each week to pick up trash, pick up tree limbs, or weed the flower beds, it would help us out a lot. Thanks to those who already do this for St. Andrews.

The number of homeless people seeking shelter and using our facility for the night seems to be increasing. While we should show compassion for those in need, please be aware of your surroundings if you go to the church early in the morning or late at night. Your safety and theirs is important.
