I think I say it too often: Where does the time go? We're looking at September, and the last quarter of 2021. Thanksgiving and Advent are rapidly approaching. Sometimes it feels like life is similar to trying to drink from a fire hydrant!

Still, in times like these, I think it's wise and necessary to remind ourselves that our lives are always gifts from God. I know it's hard sometimes, and feels too much like we're navigating through endless "toils and snares," but still life is good, even when we're navigating through those rough places.

In some ways even the tough times are good. We never get bored! Life is never boring. I mentioned "toils and snares" a moment ago. You doubtless recognize that line from John Newton's immortal hymn, "Amazing Grace." Newton's story is remarkable. He was a slave trader who became an abolitionist and a minister in the Anglican Church. Newton had served in the Royal Navy after being press ganged (kidnapped and put to work in her Majesty's navy) in his youth. His career before the mast was hard and brutal. He was flogged for desertion at one point. Newton was involved in the slave trade early in his career. Gradually, God spoke to Newton's heart, and he came to understand God's grace.

His conversion appears to have been gradual. But Newton found God (or vice versa) in a vicious storm at sea, "when he was brought to say: 'I stood in need of an Almighty Savior, and such a one I found described in the New Testament. The Lord had wrought a marvelous thing.'"

Newton left the seafaring life and, after hearing evangelist George Whitfield preach, became involved in the Evangelical Revival. He was eventually ordained and served as pastor at St. Mary Woolnoth, London, in 1779, which still stands to this day.

It's an odd and intriguing story. Newton knew God's grace personally and intimately. Newton's life was hard. It was truly "fraught with many dangers and snares", but still God's grace sought him out, even when he was lost, protected him and healed his heart, finally making him an instrument of that same grace that Newton found so amazing.

If there's one thing we have learned in the past couple of years, it's that we still need God's grace in our lives. Life can be downright frightening. In between pandemics, contentious political rancor, the new developments in Afghanistan, global warming and floods or fires depending on which coast you're on—well you get the idea.

What I am trying to say is life is life. Not too profound, but while life can be challenging and even dangerous, it's okay. The Apostle Paul, God love him said, in 1 Corinthians 10:13, "No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it."

There's grace enough for everyone. Trust in the Lord. It's going to be fine.

- July 2021 Financials;
  - Month of July Income \$6,785.76, Expenses \$10,582.32
  - Year to Date Income \$55,035.67, Expenses \$63,898.98;
- Stressing to all that St. Andrews is open and will continue to be. Once our savings are nearing exhaustion F&P will make recommendations to Session.
- The copier company finally removing the erroneous 2020 \$25 fee from our monthly bill;
- What fee should be recommended to Session to be paid to an elder filling the pulpit when a guest minister is not available;
- Considering a month-to-month contract with Pastor Marc after expiration of his current contract;
- 2021-22 Stewardship Activities mailing a letter to all members, having copies of the letter available in the sanctuary for distribution, and combining our dinner with our Thanksgiving celebration;
- Securing a list of members of the recently closed Presbyterian Church in Middleburg and mailing them a letter inviting them to worship with us at St. Andrews; and
